





FIRE STATION #8 WAS established in 1958 and is the second oldest, and busiest station in Lincoln. Located at the intersection of 17th and Van Dorn street, it serves the Country Club and Indian Village neighborhoods.

Station #8 is equipped with Truck #8, which is tasked with search, rescue, and ventilation operations at fires. Also home to Engine #8, which is responsible for fire extinguishment at fires, and responding to any medical emergencies. Station #8 is also home to Medic #8, and is responsible for medical triage, patient assessment care, and transportation.

An academic beginning

Ben and Barb, who recently celebrated their 55th wedding anniversary, found each other in an American History seminar as graduate students at the University of Maryland. As Barb recalls, the seminar consisted of her and 11 men, and Ben and another grad student were both vying for her affection.

"Ben convinced me to go to a football game with him one afternoon even though he knew I had an evening date with another grad student," Barb says. Her evening date ended up being postponed, however, and she never rescheduled. The couple was married in 1961, and in 1967, the Raders moved to Lincoln with their two young children when Ben accepted a position as professor of history at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln..

Ben has always been interested in history. He earned a Ph.D. at the University of Maryland and has been a social and cultural historian for over 50 years. 
Life in Lincoln

After 25 years on Woodsdale, the Raders moved around the block to West Summit Boulevard. and have been there since 1992.

Now retired, Ben and Barb thoroughly enjoy the life they've created together in the Country Club neighborhood. In addition to his research and writing, Ben enjoys



playing tennis as often as he can. Barb has had many hobbies over the years quilting and needlework, to name a couple—but currently she is exercising, walking her neighborhood and "learning Spanish for the umpteenth time," she said. And of course, she still spends plenty of time at the piano, occasionally with students.

The couple has traveled together extensively over the past 20 years and has been fortunate to travel with the First Plymouth Church Choir to Scandinavia, Eastern Europe and the Baltic States. Barb considers singing in the First Plymouth Church Choir and Abendmusik to be her greatest joy.

Barb takes a lot of pride in the Country Club neighborhood."This past Fourth of July, I was very upset on my afternoon walks by the amount of fireworks litter that I had to walk around," she said. "Recently, I read an article in the Christian Science Monitor about former Massachusetts Governor Mike Dukakis, walking with the interviewer in Boston, pulling out a plastic bag from his suitcase and picking up some litter. I read the article a second time and said to myself, 'I can do that!'"

SHERIDAN HISTORY by Ed Zimmer

THE WOODS **BROTHERS** BEGAN THE development of Sheridan Boulevard in 1909 with the Sheridan Place subdivision, bounded by South, 24th, 27th, and Lake Streets. Their advertisements emphasized that the infrastructure streets, sidewalks, streetlights, and street trees were all installed from the start. The developers platted the next subdivision to the south-Woodscrest-in 1916. This photo shows a remarkably tall tree being delivered by horse-cart for planting in that area. The house in the background is Frank and Nelle Cochrane Woods' new house at 2501 Sheridan, designed by Paul V. Hyland of Chicago and built in 1916. The large houselot and the whole Woodscrest subdivision were laid out by another Chicagoan, landscape architect Jens Jensen. Perhaps this tree was part of Jensen's landscape plan for Mr. Woods' grounds, or for the little park at the southwest corner of Woodscrest Boulevard.

EMERALD ASH BORER

Lynn Johnson, Director of Lincoln Parks and Recreation, recently spoke with the Mayor's Neighborhood Roundtable on the subject of Emerald Ash Borer (EAB). Here are a few highlights Country Club neighbors may find helpful.

- When EAB moves in, 100% of ash trees die within 15 years. The State Forester expects to find EAB in Lincoln this year.
- The City of Lincoln has planned a phased removal and replacement of 14,000 public street trees. Approximately 1,000 trees will be removed and replaced each year. Ash trees that are not removed will be treated with an injected insecticide to protect the trees until they can be removed.
- Homeowners can contact Community Forestry at 402-441-7847 to request their street tree be removed, however, replacement trees will not be available until 2018 at the earliest.
- Homeowners may opt to treat or remove any ash trees on their property. Visit the homeowners section of www.eabne.info for more information on EAB symptoms and treatments.

On May 5, join OLLI on a day trip to Red Cloud, Nebraska, hometown of American author Willa Cather. Cather is recognized for her novels about frontier life on the Great Plains. The day includes a tour of Cather's childhood home, exhibits at the Cather Foundation, a catered lunch at the Red Cloud Opera House and an opportunity to stroll through other historic buildings in the town. Learn about the life and work of this famous Nebraska author.

Since last summer, OLLI has been offering the "Visions of Nebraska" tours. The second tour in the series, to the Nebraska Sandhills and Niobrara Valley, takes place in June. The Sandhills tour will highlight the importance of agriculture in the region, grassland management efforts, observation of large bison herd at the Niobrara Valley Preserve and tour participants will have a chance to enjoy a canoe or tubing experience on the Niobrara River. The final tour takes place in October with a trip through Nebraska's northeast region.

"We are really excited to be a program partner of the Nebraska 150 Commission," said Dee Aguilar, OLLI coordinator. "We are looking forward to introducing events, courses and classes that focus on Nebraska's unique places, people and its history," she said.

Here a few examples of other class offerings related to Nebraska's 150th birthday:

• "The Storytellers: Media History in Nebraska" takes us on a trip through Nebraska's past with a special emphasis on the media's role in covering stories.



S'MORE Pretzel Bites



Ingredients:

- 48 pretzels
- 2 Hershey bars (24 individual chocolate pieces)
- 72 small marshmallows (3 per pretzel)

Directions:

- 1. Lay 24 pretzels on a cookie sheet (use parchment paper for an easy clean-up).
- 2. Pre-heat the broiler to high.
- 3. Place three marshmallows on each pretzel and stick in the oven for 2-3 minutes.
- 4. Place a Hershey chocolate piece on each pretzel and put back in the oven for 1-2 minutes so they melt.
- 5. Stick a pretzel on top of the chocolate.
- 6. Enjoy them all warm or put them in fridge to chill.

PINEAPPLE SALSA

Ingredients:

- Whole pineapple
- 1 cup pineapple, diced
- 1 cup peppers, diced (any combination of red, orange, yellow or green peppers)
- 1 cup Roma tomatoes, diced
- ¹/₃ cup cilantro, chopped
- ¼ cup onion, diced
- 2 limes
- Salt and Pepper
- Optional: 1 jalapeno, seeded and diced

Directions:

- To make the pineapple bowl, cut about ¹/₃ of the pineapple off, leaving the stem attached to the larger piece of the pineapple. Make a cut around the outer edge of the pineapple fruit and make cuts across the middle too. Use a metal spoon to loosen and scoop out the pineapple chunks. Pour the extra juice out of the pineapple bowl so that it is empty.
- 2. Dice enough of the pineapple chunks to make one cup of diced pineapple to be used for the salsa and save the rest for another use.
- 3. In a small bowl, mix together diced pineapple, diced tomatoes, diced peppers, minced onions, chopped cilantro, lime juice, salt, and pepper.
- 4. Transfer the salsa to the pineapple bowl for serving.

BRUSCHETTA Chicken Pasta salad



Ingredients:

- 1 pound | 500g (dry weight) thin spaghetti pasta
- 1 pound | 500g boneless, skinless, chicken breasts (2 large breasts)
- 2 teaspoons Italian seasoning
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- salt and pepper, to taste
- ¼ cup olive oil
- 2 tablespoons minced garlic
- 2 tablespoons red onion, finely chopped (about ¹/₃ of a red onion)
- 2 tablespoons balsamic vinegar (adjust to your tastes)
- 8 roma tomatoes, chopped
- ½ cup grated parmesan cheese, plus more to serve
- 2 tablespoons finely chopped fresh basil or parsley
- salt and pepper, to taste

Directions:

- Cook pasta according to package directions; Drain and rinse in cold water. Transfer to a large bowl; set aside.
- 2. While the pasta is boiling, combine the Italian seasoning, garlic powder, salt and pepper in a shallow bowl. Season the chicken on both sides. Heat 1 teaspoon of oil on in a grill pan or skillet, and sear chicken breasts over medium-high heat until browned on both sides and cooked through (about 6 minutes each side). Remove from pan; set aside and allow to rest.
- 3. Add the olive oil to the same hot pan / skillet. When hot, sauté the garlic and red onion until garlic is fragrant (about 1 minute). Turn off heat. Add in the tomatoes, toss them lightly, and add the mixture onto the pasta. Add the vinegar, parmesan cheese and basil or parsley. Season with salt and pepper to your taste. Slice the chicken; add to pasta. Toss the pasta with all of the ingredients until well combined.
- 4. Top with 2 tablespoons extra parmesan and serve immediately with balsamic glaze (optional), OR refrigerate up to an hour before serving.
